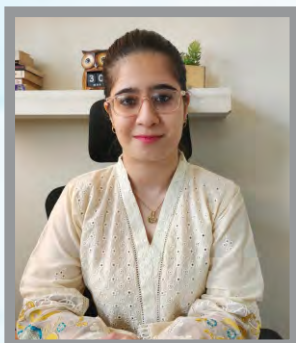
Let us promote a natural progression in mental growth and learning. Let us follow the pathway nature shows us. Let us work toward 'Inclusivity first'.
